

Revision Methods

Past Paper Questions

- **timed past paper practice** - try to complete the past paper within the time allowed for the exam. If you are unable to do this to begin with, it will get easier the more you revise.
- **grouping questions together** - make a topic pack where similar style questions are grouped together to allow you to work on one specific area.
- **doing a little bit every day** - it can be difficult to find the time to complete a whole exam, but doing one or two questions every day is an effective way to manage your time.
- **make a perfect exam paper** - use a marking scheme and past paper questions to create model answers. These could be made into flashcards for you to revise from.

Mind Maps

A visual diagram which provides an **overview or a summary** of a topic or idea.

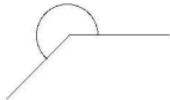
Benefits -

- They allow you to organise and group information together.
- They reduce information overload.
- We generally find it easier to remember images or diagrams.
- Mindmap structure is similar to how our brain stores information.



Flashcards

Typically contains a term or question on the front and a definition or answer on the back. They are useful for quick testing of information as well as memory. They are also easy to rearrange or group into topics.

Study Guides / Summarising notes /

Using sticky notes to summarise/ organise information

Allow you to organise your notes in a way which is meaningful to you and therefore aids memory. Summarising also allows you to reduce the total information to revise from.
